

A five-page teacher's guide gives you tips I've learned over years of helping fifth graders improve their state writing test scores.

Tips on Teaching Purpose

I went to a professional development seminar given by the people who create my state's writing test, and they told me the biggest reason students score "below standard" on the writing test is because their essays are off topic. For example, take the first writing prompt on this purpose worksheet:

In 1847, a group of English settlers arrived on Roanoke Island off the coast of North Carolina. Their governor returned to England to get supplies. When he came back to the island three years later, the colony had vanished! Read Chapter 2, The Lost Colony of Roanoke, in your history textbook. Write an essay explaining what you think happened to the colonists. Use facts and information from Chapter 2 to back up your opinion.

A student could write a beautifully organized essay with a perfect thesis statement about the history of the Lost Colony of Roanoke and still score "below standard" because the essay didn't fit on the specific topic the prompt asks for. The prompt didn't ask for the history. It asked the student to write what *he* or *she* thought happened to the colonists.

So, I make my students underline their purpose for writing every prompt. Then I have them use the exact words they see in the prompt. Often, the purpose comes very close after the word "write" in the prompt. It is *write* what you think happened to the colonists.

The second prompt on this worksheet looks like this:

Gidget! Squeak! What's that grey streak in the water? Dolphins are on the move! Look up at least three phrases an dolphins swim. Then, use the information you find to write a paragraph describing dolphins' special habits. Don't forget to cite your sources!

Students will tell you the purpose is to write about dolphins' habits. That's way too general and will earn them a "below standard" score. If they look for the word *information* they will find their specific purpose: *write a paragraph about dolphins' special habits*. Anything other than describing dolphins'

Tips on Teaching What to Use

Teach students to look for all the things they need to use, not just the obvious ones. For example, take the first prompt on this worksheet:

In 1847, a group of English settlers arrived on Roanoke Island off the coast of North Carolina. Their governor returned to England to get supplies. When he came back to the island three years later, the colony had vanished! Read Chapter 2, The Lost Colony of Roanoke, in your history textbook. Write an essay explaining what you think happened to the colonists. Use facts and information from Chapter 2 to back up your opinion.

Students need to use facts and information from Chapter 2 to back up their opinion. It's already written right there in the prompt. But these facts, they're *not* the point of the whole essay. They're background thoughts and their own opinions. I emphasize I need to use *facts* in the essay, especially an opinion. I've read Chapter 2. I know what it says. You don't need to tell me what you think about them.

For my students to only use one source, in the prompt, students are instructed to use *both* a map and a globe. Many of my kids would try to just use one. I emphasize that if the prompt asks them to use *both*, they really do have to use *both*. I tell them to remember to actually do it.
