

- Language disorders are associated with other kinds of disabilities. Coexist with other disabilities.
 - ID
 - Intellectual disabilities:
 - Can be acquired by a genetic disorder.
 - Prenatal factors i.e., rubella, maternal anaemia, prenatal trauma, fetal anaemia
 - Post-birth i.e., TBI, cranial abnormalities, lead poisoning.
 - Typically developmental patterns but tend to be delayed.
 - Semantic difficulties (smaller vocabulary)
 - Difficulty interacting with other
 - ASD
 - Language problems associated: Echolalia, perseveration, deficits in comprehension, use of short phrases, social communication problems, etc.
 - TBI
 - Can be classified into two subgroups.
 - TBI and/or CP
 - TBI-Focal injury to the brain.
 - Characterized by: Comprehension problems, word retrieval difficulty, syntactic problems, reduced speed of processing, difficulty reasoning, organization, and memory, etc.
 - CP
 - NS is affected
 - Muscular incoordination and associated problems

● 3. Children with Language Problems Associated with Physical and Social Environmental Factors

- Language disorders can be related to environmental factors such as poverty, neglect or abuse, alcohol, drug exposure in utero, and ADHD.
- LOW INCOME is not equal to DYSFUNCTION, however, socioeconomic status is vital for language development.
- Limited access to healthcare.
- Correlation between education and income level.
 - Opportunities for literacy may not be as prominent
 - Lack of enriching experiences
 - Lack of toys and books to stimulate language development
- Can be related to Neglect/Abuse
- Parental drug and Alcohol Abuse
