

## Reading Comprehension Guide

### Before You Read

#### **Choose 2:**

1. Read your homework questions.
2. Read the headings/subheadings.
3. Do a 1 min. scan of the chapter/article.

### As You Read

#### **1. Use Commas**

If a sentence is long and has commas, try reading it without the part in commas, and then with that part. (If the long sentence has no commas, add some. Read it again in chunks.)

#### **2. Highlight the "Why"**

Highlight only sentences that explain why. Key words: "because," "therefore," ...

#### **3. Add Headings**

Write headings (or sub-headings) as you read. This is an easy way to summarize as you go, and will make it easier to find information.

#### **4. Make Equations**



Translate processes into equations. For example, "When you combine red with white, you make pink" becomes "red + white = pink." You can study the equations instead of the text.

#### **5. Color Code**



Color code like this: Green = already know it. Yellow = review it. Red = continuing learn/study it.

### Avoid Rookie Mistakes!

- If you think you'd found an answer to a question, read the sentence before it to make sure you have the context.
- If you can't picture something you just read, back up. Read it again, bit by bit, until you can imagine each part.
