

Times New Roman is a serif typeface. It was commissioned by the British newspaper *The Times* in 1931 and conceived by Stanley Morison, the artistic adviser to the Berthold branch of the printing equipment company Monotype, in collaboration with Victor Lardent, a lettering artist in *The Times*' advertising department. It has become one of the most popular typefaces of all time and is available in more developments.

Morison advised on redesigns. Morison recommended that *The Times* change their font typeface from a slightly monochromatic face to a more robust, solid design, returning to traditions of printing from the eighteenth century and before. This marked a common trend in printing houses of the period. Morison proposed an older Monotype typeface named Plantin as a basis for the design, and *Times New Roman* mostly matches Plantin's dimensions. The main change was that the contrast between stroke was enhanced to give a stiffer image. The new design made its debut in *The Times* on 3 October 1932. After one year, the design was released for commercial sale in *Times New Roman's* name. Roman is an influence to the regular or roman weight (sometimes also called Antiqua), the first part of the *Times New Roman* family to be designed. Roman type has roots in Italian printing of the late 15th and early 16th centuries, but *Times New Roman's* design has no connection to Roman or to the Romans.

Typography is the art and techniques of arranging type to make written language legible, readable and appealing when displayed. The arrangement of type involves selecting typefaces, point sizes, line lengths, line spacing, character widths, and adjusting the space between pairs of letters. The art and craft of arranging typefaces is called type design. Designers of typefaces are called type designers and are often employed by type foundries. In digital typography, type designers are sometimes also called font developers or font engineers.
