

Questions Involved in Mental Status Examination

1. **Orientation:** Evaluates awareness of time and place (e.g., "What is today's date?").
2. **Attention and Concentration:** Tests focus and working memory (e.g., "Spell 'world' backward").
3. **Memory:** Assesses short-term recall (e.g., "What did you have for breakfast?").
4. **Thought Process and Content:** Examines abstract thinking and paranoia (e.g., "What does 'a rolling stone gathers no moss' mean?").
5. **Mood and Affect:** Gathers emotional state and mood range (e.g., "How are you feeling today?").
6. **Judgment and Insight:** Tests decision-making and self-awareness (e.g., "What would you do with a stamped envelope on the street?").
7. **Perception:** Screens for hallucinations or derealization (e.g., "Have you seen things others do not?").
