If we can work on what is causing the behavior issues then we will not have to worry so much about the behavior. It is important to find a cause for the behavior. Behaviors do not always need to be eliminated. There are some behaviors that we can just modify. In this book Travis tells the story of an autistic teenager who had a fetish in girls feet. He would walk up to them and tell them they had pretty feet and this was not appropriate. However, understanding that the teenager had a basic human need that he needed met, Travis was able to redirect the behavior to a more positive behavior. You will see how Travis addressed the teenagers behavior issue and helped him express himself in more appropriate ways. Behavior is communication. Travis shares with the reader how to tackle challenging autism behaviors. Travis gives the reader several tips on dealing with challenging behaviors and uses his own life as an example in how to deal with what is causing the behaviors. It is important to remember that it is easier to help a person address their basic human needs and work on what is causing the behavior before working on eliminating the behavior itself. Finding a solution or fixing what is causing the behavior can save you time, energy and effort in addressing the behavior. So when you are working with someone with autism remember to ask the question: What is causing the behavior? Here is an excerpt from the book: Behavior is always communication. Behavior is someone trying to communicate that they have a basic human need that is not being met. If someone moves something because it is in a place that they have set in before then they are exhibiting the behavior of moving the object you place in spot because that is their spot where they have always set it. It is important to remember in nearly every instance we see a behavior we have to look for and find the root cause of the behavior. If something is in my way then I need to use a behavior to move the subject out of my way so that I can have my spot back. If someone is standing in my way and I cannot talk to ask them to move then my aggressive behavior towards them might be a way for me to communicate that I have a very basic human need. I need to be able to communicate to someone that they are in my way but if I am unable to get someone to notice that they are in my way then I will have a significant behavior problem.

and I kept trying to stay positive The negative days were still present and were interfering with my ability to do the everyday things that an adult needs to do in life to support himself and be productive It wasn t until recently when things began to turn around for me My life has taken on and expanded in areas that I never thought I d see myself grow in My social skills set have improved a lot in the past month or two and I am now a lot more content with life My thoughts are positive thoughts and there are no negative thoughts If one occurs I have learned how to quickly defeat that negative thought and turn it into a positive one I do this by behavioural modification Just like with any behaviour it s important to modify it instead of taking it away completely Taking behaviour away completely can lead to many destructive things occurring It s important that when dealing with children we see what the behaviour is and then come up with a plan to modify or change the behaviour The same is true for thoughts We want to avoid all of the negative thoughts that we can We can t always just make those thoughts go away They need to be replaced with a more positive thought Cognitive Behaviour Therapy is a powerful tool for turning negative thoughts into positive thoughts I myself have benefited from Cognitive therapy more than anything else I ve tried This book is a tool for helping someone with Autism develop their self esteem and confidence Great read for parents and educators as well as adults and children with Autism
