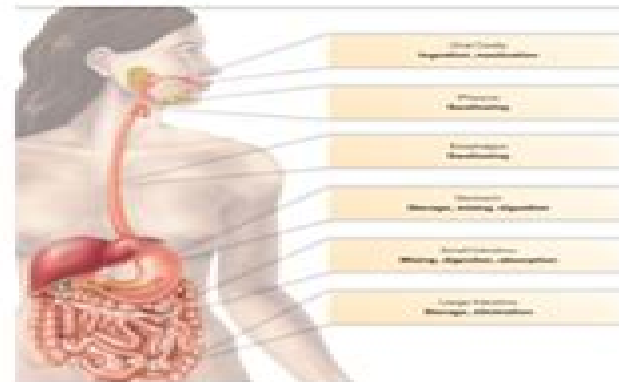
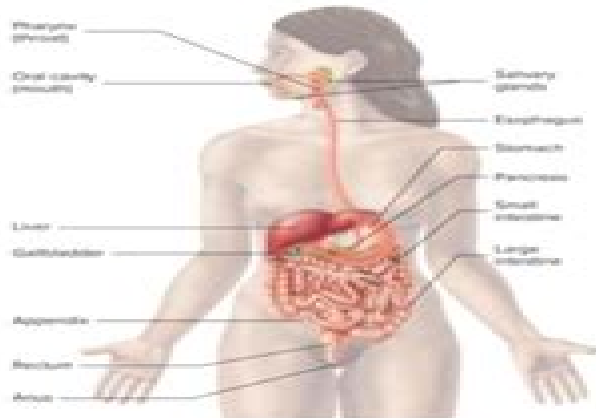


# Digestive System

The digestive tract in humans include structures for consumption of food, breakdown of food into nutrients, absorption of nutrients, and removal of wastes.



## Functions of the Digestive System

1. **Ingestion and mastication**
  - a. **ingestion:** consumption of solid or liquid food
  - b. **mastication:** chewing
2. **Propulsion and mixing –**
  - a. **propulsion:** movement of food from one end of the digestive tract to the other;
  - b. **mixing:** movement of food back and forth in the digestive tract to mix it with enzymes and facilitate absorption
3. **Digestion and secretion**
  - a. **Digestion** – the mechanical and chemical breakdown of large molecules into smaller molecules that can be absorbed
  - b. **Secretion** – addition of liquids, enzymes, and mucus to the ingested food

4. **Absorption** – movement of molecules out of the digestive tract and into the blood or lymphatic system
5. **Elimination** – removal of undigested material plus other waste products from the body as feces

The digestive system is a complex set of organs, glands, and ducts that work together to transform food into nutrients for cells.

Food is taken into digestive system, where it is broken down into smaller and smaller particles.

**Enzymes** break the particles down into small molecules which are absorbed into the blood and transported all over the body.
