Fundamental Statistics for Behavioral Sciences

Robert B. McCall, 1994

As a textbook for the first course in applied statistics this book is used primarily by students majoring in psychology education and other behavioral sciences. The author emphasizes the purpose, rationale and application of important statistical concepts over rote memorization and the mechanical application of formulas. This book does not require much background in mathematics the student need be familiar only with the thinking patterns learned in high school algebra and geometry all relevant terms and operations are reviewed in Appendix 1 the book contains many computations and problems to solve but most statistical formulas rely heavily on simple arithmetic addition subtraction multiplication division and the taking of square roots. The book presents descriptive statistics including central tendency, variability, relative position, regression and correlation. It deals with elementary inferential statistics including sampling distributions, the logic of hypothesis testing, elementary parametric tests and simple analysis of variance.
